## **AVA AND VINTAGE NOTES**

A little rain in 2016 after years of drought really pushed these vineyards into gear! As in past years, this wine is a blend of the citrus-driven old (1973) and young (1997) vines from Bien Nacido, as well as the more tropical Sierra Madre fruit, planted in the mid 1980s.

## **TASTING NOTES**

The 2016 Opening Act Chardonnay is pale yellow, which belies the not pale nature of this super snappy wine! Allow it to open up for a minute before it starts bursting with flint, wet stone, and apple pie. Tart citrus, hard peaches, and key lime pie. This wine is sooooo good!
