## **AVA AND VINTAGE NOTES**

Gold Coast was planted in 1989 above Fugler Point in Santa Maria. A mesa comprised of Sorrento Series sandy loam; the excellent drainage helps the own rooted Martini clone thrive. This Pinot Noir is powerful, but still has hallmark Santa Mark funk! Thankfully, Santa Maria was spared the wildfires that decimated much of 2020 in the northern parts of the state. While the year will be remembered for many challenges, hopefully one of the bright spots is tasty Pinot Noir.

## **TASTING NOTES**

Beautifully garnet and slightly opaque this wine exhibits hints of cranberry, spice, and sweet citrus. The first sip is fruity with pomegranate, cola, dates, and ruby red grapefruit. The finish is soft, very long and framed by refreshing acidity and cherry.
